#### 1. Decision:

- To proceed with the implementation of "20 mph speed limit" as advertised'
- To undertake further consultation on slightly more extensive waiting restrictions on Horns Road and.
- Not to consider at this time the introduction of physical width restriction with No entry at the Horns Road/Bullocks Lane junction.

#### 2. Reasons for the decision:

• The proposals are to introduce 20 mph speed limit along West Street in order to improve speed of vehicles.

The proposed '20 mph speed Limit" was designed to:

- Ensure free flow of traffic and
- Improve the speed of vehicles.

# 2.1 Informal consultation stage (18<sup>th</sup> November - 4<sup>th</sup> December 2015)

Support: 42 in favour of 20 mph speed limit,

28 in favour of No entry,

# 2.2 Formal consultation stage (26<sup>th</sup> Jan – 16<sup>th</sup> Feb 2017)

Residents and businesses that were informally consulted were informed of the consultation results. The schemes were to progress to formal consultation with:

- (a) 20 mph speed limit on West Street,
- (b) Waiting restrictions on Homs Road and,
- (c) A physical width restriction with No entry at the Horns Road/Bullocks Lane junction.

During formal consultation, we received a reply from the Hertfordshire constabulary (HC) who raised no objection.

There were 9 objections received and 5 support/object comments to some of the measures mainly the extent of DYLs and the width restriction with No entry. Also some respondents asked The Hertfordshire County Council (HCC) to consider "residents parking scheme" for the area.

Having fully considered the grounds of the objections, the decision was reached to implement the 20 mph speed limit for the area as consulted; to re-consult on the extent of the proposed DYLs and not to consider at this time the introduction of physical width restriction with No entry at the Horns Road/Bullocks Lane junction.

### 3.1 Alternative options considered and rejected <sup>2</sup>

There were objections on the proposed DYLs and the No entry proposal; these measures have been differed for further consultation and not to consider them at this time. The request for "Residents Parking Scheme" cannot be considered by HCC as this function is undertaken by East Herts District Council (EHDC).
