Subject: THE HERTFORDSHIRE (VARIOUS ROADS, CHESHUNT) (RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2016

### 1. Decision:

To proceed with the implementation of "No waiting at any time" waiting restrictions as advertised on parts of High Street, Mill Lane, Winton Drive, Hillview Gardens, Osborne Road, Landmead Road, Long Moor, Palmers Way, Norwood Road, Russell's Ride, Downfield Road, Darcy Close, Prospect Road, Robsons Close, Cadmore Lane, Fieldings Road. To proceed with the implementation of "No waiting at any time" waiting restrictions as advertised with amendments on parts of Oldfield Close.

#### 2. Reasons for the decision:

• The proposals are to introduce No waiting at any time waiting restrictions following concerns received about the current on-street parking causing reduced forward visibility and obstructing access at various junctions and locations identified.

The proposed scheme was designed to:

- Maintain access and visibility for both pedestrians and vehicular traffic,
- Ensure free flow of traffic and
- Discourage inconsiderate parking.

Residents/businesses that were informally consulted were informed of the consultation results. The scheme was to progress to formal consultation.

During formal consultation, we received a reply from the Hertfordshire Constabulary (HC) who raised no objection.

There were 4 objections received during the formal stage from Oldfield Close/Mill Lane. The objectors cited lack of parking places in the area caused by many factors including a nearby school. Lack of parking places within the area was considered not to have significant impact on the proposals as this was known before the consultation period. Having fully considered the grounds of the objections, the decision is to overrule the objections and proceed to sealing of the Order as advertised with the exception of Oldfield Close were the double yellow lines will be reduced to seek consistency with the other proposals.

The measures are consistent with the Highway Code (clause 243) which states that "Do not stop or park anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services, at or near a bus or tram stop or taxi rank, opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space, opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle, where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles, in front of an entrance to a property, on a bend, where you would obstruct cyclists' use of cycle facilities except when forced to do so by stationary traffic."

### 3.1 Alternative options considered and rejected <sup>2</sup>

There were changes made at Mill Lane junction with Oldfield Close by reducing the length of the double yellow lines; the rest of the other proposals remain unchanged throughout the process.
