If all supporting documents are received and approved, a stage 1 licence will be granted. If there are missing documents that are required for the application, this may delay the granting of the licence.

With regard to illuminated/powered attachments a stage 2 licence will be required. Once a stage one licence is granted and the attachments are fitted and tested, the test results must be sent through and approved prior to a stage 2 licence is granted.

Section 1a – details of the attachment

Details of the attachments you are proposing to attach to the street lighting column etc.

Section 1b & 1c - Insurance

A certificate of insurance, indemnifying the Highway Authority against any third party claims due to installation, operation and/or removal of the decorations and any consequential damage to Highway Authority property by the Operator.

The minimum level of insurance indemnification shall be determined by the Highway Authority and is currently £10 million pounds in respect of any one incident.

Section 1d & 1e Anchorage Systems for cross-road attachments and seasonal decorations

No decorations, cables, supports or other attachments are to be fitted to Highway Authority apparatus without written consent of the Highway Authority.

No attachments are to be made to any bracket arm or extension fitted to a lighting column or traffic sign without the specific approval of the Highway Authority.

Approval for attachments will only be given when the Operator has demonstrated, by testing and calculation that the structural integrity of the apparatus to which the attachments are to be made will not be compromised

Each anchorage and catenary wire span must be visually inspected annually by a suitably competent person. The inspection must confirm that the material into which the anchorage is made is sound and has not deteriorated to the extent that a further inspection or load test is necessary. The results of the inspection must be recorded in the anchorage and catenary register.

Section 1f, 1g – Duration of attachment

Section 1h – Contractors RAMS and TM details

Details of the contractor's risk assessments, Method statements and Traffic Management details to ensure safe working on the highway.

Section 1i & 1j – Operators and Contractors emergency contact numbers

Details the operators and contractor's emergency details in case there is an emergency and we need to contact the relevant people to repair attachments to street lighting furniture and other attachments.

Section 2a - Supplies and energy

The Operator is responsible for arrangements with the Distribution Network Operator (DNO) for electrical supplies and the payment of charges in relation to energy consumption.

Section 2b & 2c - Electrical requirements

The extension of the festive lighting is responsible for the electrical safety of the temporary festive lighting in accordance with the current BS 7671 (IET Wiring Regulations). The permanent installation (column, wall mount, socket and wiring) are the responsibility of the Highway Authority.

Section 2d - Protection against electric shock

Where the decorations or set pieces are mounted at or less than three metres above ground level additional precautions, such as a barrier of suitable design and construction, shall be provided as a means to keep the public at a safe distance of at least two metres from any part of the decoration(s).

Section 2e - Hours of operation

Hours of operation in the case of illuminated festive decorations.
