## The Dewey System

## How the Dewey system works

The Dewey system divides the whole of knowledge into ten categories:

| 000s | General knowledge | Computers, libraries, newspapers, encyclopedias |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| 100s | The Mind | Feelings, animal rights |
| 200s | Religion | Religions, comparative religion, myths |
| 300s | Society | Communication, pollution, families, settlements, <br> conservation, jobs, schools, shops, transport, costume, <br> customs |
| 400s | Language | Dictionaries, thesauri, word books, writing, other <br> languages |
| 500 s | Science and maths | Maths, science, the Earth, weather, dinosaurs, nature |
| $600 s$ | Technology | Inventions, medicine, human body, health, materials, <br> machines, farming, pets, food, cooking, home life, <br> building |
| $700 s$ | The Arts | Architecture, sculpture, crafts, toys, drawing, painting, <br> photography, music, dance, sport |
| $800 s$ | Literature | Poetry, plays |
| $900 s$ | Geography and history | Landscapes, explorers, atlases, ancient history, British <br> history, countries (their geography and history) |

Each "hundred" contains further subdivisions which are subdivided again to narrow down the subject, with decimals used to extend the number, e.g. 500s science $\rightarrow 590$ zoology $\rightarrow 599$ mammals $\rightarrow 599.4$ bats

Each subject has its own number.
The books are labelled on their spines and kept in strict order from 000 to 999, e.g. on a shelf you might have these books:
